Key results

Overall safety: While only 5% of Australians feel unsafe overall, this is significantly higher among those aged 40-54, those living in Melbourne, the unemployed, in low personal income households, and those who identify as being of Indian ethnic background.

Despite only 5% of Australians feeling unsafe overall, not many feel very safe either (20%), indicating that there are broad concerns across a range of areas in the lives of Australians.

During daylight OR night-time hours:

More than half (57%) of Australians feel unsafe during daylight OR night-time hours. Over a third of Australians (36%) feel unsafe at any point doing day to day activities during daylight hours. This rises to over half (53%) when doing these same activities after dark.

The activities Australians feel most unsafe doing during the day include using licensed taxis (15%), going to the cinema/ theatre (15%) and using public transport (14%).

When it comes to activities during the night, Australians feel most unsafe using public transport (33%), being at local parks/sportsgrounds (31%) and walking in their local streets (26%).

Using *public transport* is a concern both day and night, being in the top three in both situations. Feelings of being unsafe on public transport is significantly higher among females, those not currently employed, and among lower income Australians.

While being at local parks/ sportsground and walking local streets are not a key concern during the day, these rise to become key concerns of Australians at night.

Key results regarding living in Australia

38% of Australians feel unsafe living in Australia from the risks of cyber or terrorist attacks, robbery or assault. This is significantly higher among females, 18-24 year olds, the unemployed, and those who identify as being of Chinese ethnic background.

Australians are most concerned about cyber attacks (24%), followed by robbery (21%) and physical assault (19%). As many as 18% are concerned about sexual assault and 15% fear terrorist attacks on Australian soil.

1 in 4 fear the risk of assault (sexual or physical), particularly females, 18-24 year olds, those who are employed part-time, work in retail, are semi-skilled workers, have lower personal or household income, and those who have five or more people in their household.

Cyber attacks (24%): Fear of cyber attacks is significantly higher among those whose work is located in the town centre or CBD. IT workers are equally as likely to fear cyber attacks but more feel very safe (16% compared to 8% total). Regular internet users are also equally as likely to feel unsafe from the risk of cyber attacks.

Robbery (21%): Fear of robbery is significantly higher among females (particularly 40-54 year olds), the unemployed or employed part-time, semi-skilled workers, and lower household income Australians.

Physical assault (19%): Fear is significantly higher among females, 18-24 year olds, (particularly Females 18-24 and 40-54), the unemployed or employed part-time, semiskilled workers, retail workers, lower income Australians, large families of 5 or more, or of Indian ethnicity.

Sexual assault (18%): This is higher among females, 18-24 year olds, (particularly Females 18-54), those employed part-time, semiskilled workers, or in large families of 5 or more.

Terrorist attacks (15%): Feeling unsafe from terrorist attacks is higher for females (particularly 55+ year olds), semi-skilled workers, and Asians (excluding Chinese).

Key results regarding cyber and online security

Almost 1 in 4 (24%) Australians feel unsafe from the risk of **cyber attacks** in Australia. While, personal and work based cyber security is a concern for over 2 in 5 (41%) Australians.

Key concerns are around shopping from foreign retailers, global retailers and using social media, with these consistent whether using personal or workplace IT.

Personal cyber and online security:

Australian retailers are perceived as being the safest place to shop, compared to nearly a third of Australians feeling unsafe shopping online from foreign retailers. While almost 1 in 5 (19%) are concerned about using social media sites.

Older Australians and females are more likely to be concerned for their personal cyber and online safety.

Work-based situations: Across most situations except for shopping online from foreign or global retailers, safety concerns are higher when using company IT. Females and those aged 55+ are more likely to feel unsafe across work related situations, particularly being at their work premises at night.

The ASIAL ASCI Index Explained

The ASIAL ASCI research uses a 7-point Likert Scale, where 1 means Very unsafe and 7 means Very safe.

A nationally representative sample of Australians were asked about a range of situations and then asked:

Overall, thinking about your day to day life, how safe do you feel?

Feels unsafe = bottom 3 box (i.e. responded 1-3)

Neutral = 4

Feels safe = top 3 box (i.e. responded 5-7)

"Risk of coronavirus anywhere in public."

"Walking in local streets because of strangers or people who may do me harm."

"Online: security is an illusion, either from hackers or unscrupulous persons hiding behind a, seemingly, legitimate front. Offline: COVID. It could be anywhere, anytime."

"There are lots of unstable people out there in the world which you come into close contact with. I feel unsafe particularly at night-time in the community on public transport and going to my local hospital. I am also scared of being out at night-time."

"Mostly due to current COVID situation in public areas. Also feel like Facebook and Instagram are accessing too much personal data."

"There are to many crimes among the youth today so there are times I'm not feeling safe, also there can be some shady characters about."

"I am worried about going to the doctors because of COVID-19. I think public transport is generally unsafe and not social distanced properly. I think sporting areas, educational institutes and walking the local streets is dangerous if you are a woman at night."

"I feel most unsafe when I'm alone at night-time in spaces that are not overly populated or where I'm in close range of strangers."





















Appendix I

Verbatim comments

Public transport is mainly a concern during night-time hours due to the types of people, risk of harm and lack of security presence

Safety concerns



Using public transport

"Night-time using public transport of within the city. Intoxicated people make me feel uneasy and there often is not much police or security presence" Female 25-39 QLD

"During <u>Night-time hours</u> - Using public transport e.g. trains, buses or ferries This when you get people who you can not trust, who may have a criminal background who may want to steal your purse etc."

Female 40-54 WA

"<u>Night- time</u> using public transport as there are some unstable and creepy people"

Female 25-39 NSW

"At <u>night-time</u>, at the train station. There's been incidents of stabbings in nearby train stations before" Male 18-24 VIC

"Public transport at <u>night</u>. The lack of supervision worries me + lack of social distancing." *Male 55+ QLD*

"Using public transport at <u>night</u>. Behaviour of other travellers" Female 55+ VIC

"Public transport at <u>night</u> because of repeated bashings etc on the local train service" *Male 55+ QLD*

"If I was to be in the CBD or on public transport at night I would feel unsafe because <u>night-time</u> is when the crazies come out. Alcohol and drug use is more prevalent at night-time and can lead to aggression and violence." Male 55+ WA

"I would avoid any public transport in the evening, there can be a lot of people that I would not like to be around" Female 55+ SA/NT

"There can be homeless people or people who have mental health problems or on drugs in the CBD or on public transport at night" Female 55+ SA/NT

"There are too many idiots catching public transport." Male 55+ SA/NT

"Being in public transport as there are not enough people in the carriages on the train or at the stations..." Female 55+ VIC

"Using Public Transport including Taxis. I feel trapped in a vehicle with a strange man. Public Transport makes me feel very unsafe because a dangerous situation could occur instantly e.g.- people on drugs, youth violence, racism. People, mostly men I'm afraid are too unstable these days." Female 40-54 QLD

"Catching public transport. This is because there is a lot of people on trains and buses that like to cause trouble and most of the time security guards are standing together on a different carriage" Male 25-39 SA/NT

"Using public transport because there are far too many weirdos and people high on drugs" Female 25-39 VIC

"I feel most unsafe in licenced taxis during night-time hours due to previous experience of harassment by taxi drivers." Female 18-24 NSW

"At night in taxi based on <u>personal negative</u> experience with driver." Female 55+ VIC

"Taxis because of the <u>stories you hear</u>."

Male 18-24 QLD

"Using licenced Taxis as we hear a lot of incidents about taxis." Female 55+ NSW

"Taxi's. Just some stories told (old and new) are sometimes hard to forget. Sometimes taxi drivers take advantage of the area that you don't know." Female 40-54 NSW

"...Taxis also place you in a <u>vulnerable</u> <u>position</u> as you're in a lockable, enclosed space with a stranger and you're relying on them not having ill-intent." Female 25-39 QLD

"Using public transport at night - there are no official people to stroll the public transport - we need more security day and night. In the past I have not felt safe in a taxi, the driver either talks too much or you cannot understand him. Some try to take advantage in the way they travel to where you want to go." Female 55+ VIC

"Using taxis during [night] time hours. A lot of the drivers are from countries where sexual assault and violence against women is out of control and goes unpunished."





"Being in the CBD alone at <u>night-time</u> - I would really never do it because I feel too vulnerable being a female, alone and in the same" Female 18-24 VIC

"<u>Night-time</u> in the CBD because There are dodgy people around every corner."

"I feel very unsafe about being in the City of a <u>night</u>. There are too many young people who want to steal, assault and do other crimes because there are no consequences for their actions..." Female 55+ OLD

"On my own at <u>night-time</u> in the city. Because I see on the TV what can happen being on your own." Female 25-39 VIC

"Night-time in CBD. Lots of strangers."

Male 18-24 VIC

"Being in CBD during <u>night hours</u> is most dangerous, drug addicts are out and quite violent, and all COVID-19 rules are not followed, police do not respond to any incidents unless there is revenue involved."

"Being in the CBD at <u>night</u> because you just never know what might happen." Female 25-39 VIC

"There is far too much crime in the city.

There is no police and no prison for criminals" Male 40-54 VIC

"Our local CBD is where most of the nightclubs and bars are so been around them at <u>night</u> when people have been drinking is not a very safe thing to do especially alone although there is a police presence at these places." Female 40-54 QLD

"Most unsafe being in CBD - lots of alcohol/drug using people and no safety." Female 25-39 WA "I feel the most unsafe when I'm alone, especially at <u>night-time</u> in <u>parks or CBD</u>. I feel even more unsafe if there a lone men around me, or groups of men." Female 18-24 WA

"In <u>parks or CBD</u> at <u>night</u> can't see well enough not enough lighting or people around not enough Police presence" Female 55+ SA

"There can be homeless people or people who have mental health problems or on drugs in the <u>CBD</u> or on <u>public transport</u> at <u>night</u>." Female 55+ SA/NT

"If I was to be in the <u>CBD or on public</u> <u>transport</u> at <u>night</u>, I would feel unsafe because night-time is when the crazies come out. Alcohol and drug use is more prevalent at night-time and can lead to aggression and violence." *Male 55+ WA*

Lack of proper lighting and perception of unsavoury types being about make parks feel unsafe, particularly at night

"...most parks, sports grounds and schools are unattended at <u>night</u> so I would be a little scared" Female 40-54 QLD

"Being at local park at <u>night-time</u> as I am not sure who else might be in the area and as at night-time there is not many people out and about I can get help or attention from in the event someone chooses to do me harm or attack me and if the know I am female of petite build I probably would be seen as an easy target." Female 40-54 WA

"Being around at parks and sports ground at night because there are not much security and dark." Female 40-54 VIC

"I generally avoid parks at <u>night</u> as they're not safe for women, in particular, at night."

"Because be female and out alone around parks and schoolgrounds is not a safe thing to do unfortunately" Female 40-54 SA/NT "Most parks aren't well lit at <u>night</u> and don't have a lot of people around" Female 18-24 VIC

"Definitely in parks at <u>night</u> as its easy for abductions/murder" Male 18-24 VIC

"Walking in parks and streets alone <u>after dark</u>, as this is when the criminals are out looking for an easy target." Female 55+ VIC

"I would never go to my local parks or sportsgrounds at <u>night</u>. They lighting is usually not very good and it feels very spooky and there are not usually other people around." Female 55+ VIC

"During <u>Night-time</u> hours - Being at local parks or sportsgrounds. As a young woman, this is the scariest thing for me. The reason why is clear... fear of something happening. I don't feel comfortable talking about it." Female 18-24 WA "...Being at local parks or sportsgrounds, you don't know who is around" Male 55+ VIC

"...Also parks and sportsgrounds at <u>night</u> isn't a very good idea either as there could be people staying there and don't want to be disturbed, it could be as harmless as a homeless person sleeping or others doing drugs or drinking." Female 40-54 QLD

"Local <u>streets</u>, parks and sportsgrounds. I do not see police officers or security cameras" Males 40-54 NSW

"...And shopping from <u>foreign retailers</u>! don't know if they are going to have hidden charges and of are trustworthy."

"Shopping online from <u>foreign retailers</u> as I do not know who or what I am dealing with." Female 55+ QLD

"Shopping online from <u>foreign retailers</u>, because my credit card has been compromised before." Female 25-39 QLD "Shopping online from <u>foreign</u> <u>retails</u> because you don't know if it is legit or not." *Male 25-39 VIC*

"I believe that <u>overseas website</u> might not be genuine and in fact I would use them only use Coles and a few others." Female 55+ NSW

"...I don't feel safe because of security risks with online shopping." Male 55+ VIC

"Shopping online because so many scammers around." Female 55+ SA/NT

"Any sort of shopping or <u>banking</u>. It's too easy to steal people identities and money from accounts." Female 40-54 VIC

"...Shopping online retailers - not as good cyber protection - stealing credit card details." Female 40-54 OLD

Background, objectives and Omnibus methodology

The business context



ASIAL - A peak body for security professionals

- Covering small, medium and large businesses across all sectors of the security industry, ASIAL is the peak body for the Australian security industry.
- As the key industry voice, ASIAL lobbies all levels of Government, trying to drive consistently high standards and codes of conduct in the industry.
- For members it provides advice and assistance to increase the professionalism of the sector.

However, little is known about the security sentiment of everyday Australians

- ASIAL has not done much work understanding the security sentiments in Australia.
- As a result, there are potentially gaps in both personal, work life and national security, as well as offline and online security concerns that may not be addressed by the current infrastructure or policies.



Next steps

- ASIAL sees an opportunity to further drive thought leadership and optimize the body's objectives by understanding Australian's confidence level of safety/security in their day-to-day lives.
- Further, by understanding this, ASIAL can help members talk to clients/potential clients, can put security on the political agenda and create better collective knowledge in the sector, and in doing so, lead the way in supporting greater collaboration to meet the needs of everyday Australians.

Research objectives and topics



Key research objectives

- 1. Take a pulse of the Australian population with regards to personal and workplace safety/security
- 2. Generate insights that can be used by members to inform conversations with clients
- 3. Generate insights that can be used with all levels of Government to try and lobby for more uniform standards across Australia with greater collaboration across states
- 4. Improve collective knowledge and provide thought leadership that can be used for PR purposes for ASIAL
- 5. Generate a benchmark or "ASIAL Security Index" which would allow for a more continuous understanding of impact of policy change, improvement in standards etc. to be measured against longitudinally

Topics covered

- 13 **offline** situations Australians might find themselves in, from being in their own home to being out and about. These situations have been duplicated to understand safety fears during daylight and night-time hours
- 7 online personal cyber and online security situations Australians might find themselves in, from online banking to sending emails
- For workers, work-based safety concerns across 10 offline and online situations
- Overall safety in day to day lives and general perception of safety from the risks of cyber or terrorist attacks as part of living in Australia (Confidence Safety Index)
- Understand the 'why' behind situations in which Australians feel most unsafe


